Re: Short memo comparing Puerto Rican education expenditure to various nations

As a percentage of GNP, Puerto Rico spends more on education than either of the five comparison countries and all but three Latin American and Caribbean countries.

The table over page provides raw figures and rankings of education expenditure as a percentage of GNP for 30 countries in addition to Puerto Rico including:

- Ireland, Korea, Mexico, Venezuela, the Dominican Republic and the US as specific comparison countries
- Remaining Latin American and Caribbean countries for broad comparisons

This analysis was intended to provide a quick overview of the situation. The primary finding is that presented above.

Figures availability and measurement problems.

- Puerto Rico's education figures do not represent all education expenditure rather only that for schools and universities. This represents under rather than over measurement however if the figures were complete, Puerto Rico's ranking would rise higher.
- I am concerned about the year \$ comparisons as the UNESCO data (which comprises all but the Puerto Rico data, does not provide details of \$ years. The standard is to expect that it is in current dollars however that has not been confirmed.
- As discussed, Puerto Rico's GNP is not a particularly representative measure. If 1994 GNP is adjusted downwards by one third (from \$26,640.9M to \$18337.3M), Puerto Rico's education expenditure rises to 10.3% of GNP, whereby the Commonwealth would lead all of the countries presented here.
